SUMMARY OF PROGRESS: FUILL-YEAR 2009/10

PRINCIPAL ISSUES

Anti-Social Behaviour

Incidents of anti-social behaviour have been decreasing over the past year, in particular vandalism has reduced by 21% compared to the first six months of 2008/09 and youth nuisance complaints have reduced by 33%. However, it should be noted that recording practices in relation to ASB are currently under review and therefore the trend information needs to be treated with some caution. A number of actions have contributed to this, in particular the deployment of the Community Task Force and the development of youth initiatives such as Friday Nite Projects.

Alcohol and Drugs

The number of crimes committed in Angus by offenders who are under the influence of alcohol have reduced by 9% compared with the same period last year and the quantity of alcohol seized from young people has reduced. The Community Safety Partnership has worked closely with Focus on Alcohol Angus on a number of projects which are having a positive impact in this area including: Total Dry Up (with TCA and WEB Project), Alcohol Awareness Week and the Best Bar None scheme.

Care should be taken not to attempt to correlate any increase or decrease in the number of Class A Drugs offences with any rise or decline of availability of Class A Drugs within our communities. A rise in crimes can more directly be attributed to increased levels of pro-activity on the part of Tayside Police to combat those dealing such commodities, as evidenced by the work of Tayside Police Community Task Force and the Divisional Community Support Team, as well as locally based Section Officers.

Public Protection and Safety

The 2009 Community Safety Survey suggests that more people in Angus feel safe at night (69%) and the majority (94%) feel safe during the day. There is an overall reduction (10%) in the volume of crimes 1 to 4 recorded and the number of violent crimes reported is also meeting the target set. A number of successful seasonal safety campaigns have been undertaken as well as significant inputs from crime prevention services, including mobile CCTV, to help tackle these issues.

Road Safety

The number of adults killed or seriously injured in Angus this year has reduced by 33% compared to the same period last year, despite the worst winter and road conditions for years. A number of proactive campaigns have been undertaken by Tayside Fire & Rescue which contributed to this success, including Driving Ambition and 'Safe Drive, Stay Alive'.

OTHER ISSUES

Hate Crime

Reported incidents of hate crime are extremely low, with high detection rates for those offences that are reported. There has also been a reduction in the number of racially aggravated incidents reported.

Acquisitive Crime

Over the past year, incidents of shoplifting have reduced by 22.5% and the number of motor vehicle crimes has reduced by 31%. However, recorded incidents of housebreaking have marginally increased. (See Point ❶ below). A number of initiatives have contributed to this reduction, including Operation After Dark, Safe as Houses (in partnership with Angus Care & Repair) and Doorstoppers (in conjunction with Trading Standards), as well as the deployment of community wardens and police patrols to 'hotspot areas'.

Fire Safety

Incidents of fires have been reducing over the past few years, in line with national trends, and the number of home dwelling fires in Angus has reduced by 33.5% over the past year. Home Fire Safety Visits have exceeded target and have increased by 124% from the previous year.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION AND ACTION:

Only 2 indicators are failing to meet the target (see below).

❶ 2009/10 saw a failure to meet the target in respect of crimes of housebreaking to domestic dwellings, with an increase of 13 crimes from the baseline figure of 96 crimes across the whole of Angus in 2008/09. Whilst it would be easy to attribute a rise in this crime type to the economic downturn, the small increase in this crime category should be measured against a significant reduction in overall Group 1 to 4 crimes. There is no specific reason that can be identified for the rise in housebreakings but it should be borne in mind that despite the rise, of just over 1 crime per month, the figures are small in comparison to other Local Authority areas and Angus remains a very safe place to stay.

❷ Tayside Fire & Rescue have implemented a new management information system and the recording of home fires now includes less serious injuries like minor smoke inhalation. The targets set last year will be reviewed and revised to reflect this change in procedures. The one fatality to date was due to a criminal act but is still recorded as a fire fatality.

SUMMARY OF PROGRESS:

Acquisitive Crime: Over this reporting period there has been a marginal increase in the number of crimes of dishonesty reported, including housebreaking, shoplifting and vehicle crime. A number of Community Safety Partnership initiatives have contributed to helping to tackle this anticipated increase, including Operation After Dark, Safe as Houses (in partnership with Angus Care & Repair) and Doorstoppers initiative (in conjunction with Trading Standards). Doorstoppers were commended at the recent Scottish Policing Awards.

Anti-Social Behaviour: A large number of proactive projects have been undertaken to address issues of antisocial behaviour across Angus. Evaluation of these projects would suggest that there is a cumulative benefit for communities across the county – e.g. Friday Nite Projects in Kirriemuir and Arbroath (national commendation award winner), Witches Project in Montrose, deployment of Community Task Force and Community Wardens in Montrose & Brechin, and the development of a number of community based projects such as Street Games For All and Adopt a School initiative.

Alcohol and Drugs: The number of offences committed in Angus by offenders who are under the influence of alcohol have reduced. The Community Safety Partnership has worked closely with the Angus Alcohol & Drugs Partnership on a number of projects which are having a positive impact including: Total Dry Up (with TCA and WEB Project), Alcohol Awareness Week and the Best Bar None scheme. A number of age restricted sales operations have also been undertaken in partnership with Trading Standards.

Fire Safety: There has been a 124% increase in the number of fire safety visits undertaken, which has contributed towards a significant reduction in reported dwelling fires across Angus. A number of proactive educational campaigns have also been undertaken, including Young Firefighters, Safe Angus and Fire Academy.

Hate Crime: There are currently no identified issues within Angus in relation to community tensions or hate crimes. Reported incidents of hate crime are extremely low, with high detection rates for those offences that are reported. The creation of a single point of contact for sharing information between partners within the Community Safety Partnership has been of benefit in identifying any potential areas of concern.

Public Protection and Safety: The volume and rate of recorded crimes and offences has reduced by 18% compared to last year. Various joint initiatives have been undertaken by the Joint Services Team, APODA and other partners which have had a positive impact in areas such as domestic violence e.g. women's safety seminars and the launch of the Domestic Violence Alarms initiative. Public Safety Campaigns have also been undertaken, including the roll out of thousands of polycarbonate glasses via the licensed trade as part of the Best Bar None scheme. Operation Festive Homesafe and the deployment of the Community Task Force to Montrose and Brechin have also had an impact.

Road Safety: There has been a reduction in the number of people killed or seriously injured in Angus. A number of proactive campaigns have been undertaken by Tayside Fire & Rescue which contributed to this success, including Driving Ambition and 'Safe Drive, Stay Alive'.

Terrorism and Community Tensions: Delphinus Group has been established in Angus to take forward the national 'Protect Now' agenda and deliver 'Act Now' training to all partner agencies.

AREAS REQUIRING CONSIDERATION AND ACTION:

- ❶ Policy being developed in conjunction with Scottish Crime & Drugs Enforcement Agency
- ❷ Funding received by Forfar ICSYP and PARC project to be instigated in 2010.
- ❸ The Angus RIMAP (Racist Incidents Multi-Agency Panel) has not met for some time but will incorporate this action into a new work programme which is being developed for 2010. Tayside Police are to call meeting to assess and review the current situation.
- ❹ ASB road safety event to be undertaken later in 2010.
- ❺ Alcohol Diversionary Scheme to be considered for 2010 – dependent on appropriate funding.
- ❻ This will be dependant on resources – further discussions with TCA to take place.
- ❼ Legislation in respect of licensing is not yet fully in force in Scotland. The role of Trading Standards in respect of the sale of knives may not be as great as first envisaged.

FUTURE AREAS OF WORK

The Community Safety Partnership has undertaken a third Strategic Assessment between January and March 2010 which has set the key priorities for 2010/2011 as well as reviewed the principal issues identified for this current year.
